a New Commission of the peace and Dedimus Potest.^m was
produced and read whereupon Pursuant to the said
Dedimus Joseph Gray had the oaths appointed by act of
Parliament to be taken instead of the oaths * * * * *
of allegiance, and supremacy the abjuration oath
and test administer'd to him by John Person and
Samuel Blom, which he took, and subscrib'd the test &
also the oath of a Justice of peace and Justice in Chancery
which was also administer'd to him by the said John
Person and Sam^l Blom, and then the said Joseph Gray
administer'd all the said oaths to Albrighton Jones
Peter Butts Sam^l Blom, Thomas Williamson, John Person
and Henry Taylor which they took, and severally sub-
scrib'd the said Test -

The last will and Testament of Moody Kirby was
presented in court by Francis Kirby. the Exor therein
named proved by the oaths of William Simmons and
John Ingram witnesses thereto and order'd to be re-
corded. and on the motion of the said Exor who made
oath according to law certificate was granted him for
obtaining a probat. hereof giving security whereupon
the said Francis Kirby with William Simmons his
security enter'd into and acknowledg'd their Bond
in the penalty of five hundred pounds for the due &
faithfull administration on the decedents estate and
performance of his will.
