And on the motion of Sarah Crocker who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted her for obtaining Letters of Administration with the will of the said Elisha and need giving security. Whereupon the said Sarah Crocker with John Wilkinson and Benjamin Lewis his securitys enter'd into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of one thousand pound for the due and faithfull administration on the decas'd estate and performance of his will.

Order'd that Jacob Barnes John Fort Benjamin Wood and Daniel Barrow or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Elisha Crocker and return the appraisement to this court.

The last will and Testament of John Arington was this day presented in court by Benjamin Arington one of the Executors therein named proved by the oaths of Charles Simmons John Simmons and Benjamin Simmons the Witnesses thereto and order'd to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executors certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat giving security. Whereupon the said Benjamin Arington with Charles Simmons and Peter Butts enter'd into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of Two thousand pounds for the due and faithfull administration on the decas'd estate and performance of his will.

Order'd that Charles Simmons Miles Cary John Brown and Ambrose Williams or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Arington and return the appraisement to this court.
