pended

Upon the petition of Robert Johnson against  
Henry Stanison admiral &c<sup>a</sup> of John Scott, <sup>for £4.6.</sup>  
<sup>due by acco.</sup> This day came the  
plaintiff by his attorney as well the de-  
fendant in his proper person who confess'd the al-  
legation in the said petition to be just Therefor  
It is consider'd that the plaintiff recover agst  
the said defendant the aforesaid sum of four  
pounds six and his cost by him in this behalf  
expended

Upon the petition of William Springton against  
Edward Tanner for Two pounds ten shillings  
and seven pence due by acco.<sup>b</sup> This day came the  
plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being  
duly summoned and serv'd with a copy of the  
petition and acco.<sup>b</sup> and not appearing on the  
motion of the plaintiff who prov'd his demand  
to be just It is consider'd by the court that the  
plaintiff recover against the said defendant  
the aforesaid sum of two pounds ten shillings  
and seven pence and his cost by him in this  
behalf expended
