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oaths of William Edwards witness thereto and on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1761 the same was further proved by the oath of William Simmons another of the witnesses thereto and thereupon the said Indenture memorandum and receipt together with the commission annexed for taking the acknowledgment and privy examination of the within named Sarah and a certificate of Execution thereof were order'd to be recorded.

An Inventory and appraisement of the estate of John Strengton was this day returned and order'd to be recorded.

William Taylor guardian to Mary Taylor this day returned an acc<sup>t</sup> of his guardianship of the said estate which was sworn to examined and approved by the court and order'd to be recorded.

Present Ath<sup>rs</sup> Jones & Thomas Williamson, absent Samuel Blom and Jesse Brown.

Nevett Foster guardian of James Shock this day returned an acc<sup>t</sup> of his guardianship of the said orphan's estate which being sworn to examined and approved by the court and order'd to be recorded.

Order'd that the Churchwardens bind out Mary Henry John and Lemuel Children of William Roe according to laws.

Order'd that the Treasurer of this county pay Wm<sup>m</sup> Andrews Eight pounds Ten shillings for building a bridge below Collins Mill and that he also pay Ambrose Williams & one pound eight shillings & five pence for repairs and plank of the aforesaid bridge and acco<sup>ts</sup> for the same.

Order'd that the overseers of the highway turn the road and make up a causeway to the bridge lately erected below Collins Mill by direction of Peter Butts and Miles Cary.

Order'd that Thomas Gray Sam<sup>l</sup> Slade Shodges Council and Lewis Joyner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of John Benson dec'd and return the appraisement to this court.
