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"bearing South eighty two degrees west and kept
 that course passing thro the lands of an orphan
 of Etheldred Taylor Thence thro Thomas Davis
 Robert Baily's & Benjamin Ruffins land down opposite
 to James Statons plantation passing thro near one hundred
 red yards of Statons dwelling house and coming in wth
 the adjominsack swamp about half a mile below the
 County line thence thro the said swamp computing the
 distance of swamp ground to be near half a mile
 whereof one half to be bridge and the other a cause-
 way passing thro Thomas Skines land and thence
 thro John Skines land thro a per copen that must be
 causeway a for near one quarter of a mile and thence
 to the new road We have also viewed away an old
 fording place by Benjamin Ruffins and believe twill be
 left trouble & charge to make a passage there across the
 said swamp but it is near a mile below out of the true
 course and also we think it impracticable to pass
 that way by reason of the said Ruffins fences we con-
 pute the distance of New Road to be cleared in a direct
 line about 5/8 miles"

 tending the opening and clearing the road thro this
 county lately moved for by them and desire them
 to desist from prosecuting the order as aforesaid

 inspectors of Beef Park for the County

On the motion of Benjamin Stinson Joseph Stinson
 witnesses for William Ivy at the suit of William Edwards
 ordered that the said Ivy pay them respectively one hundred
 red pounds of Tobacco each for four days attendance
 on this court according to law

On the motion of Robert Stinson and Benjamin
 Evans witnesses for William Edwards against William
 Ivy ordered that the said Edwards pay them respect-
 ively one hundred pounds of Tobacco for four days
 attendance on this court according to law

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court
 in course
