

The last will and Testament of Nicholas Gurley was this day presented in court by George Gurley and Joseph Cobb executors therein named proved in the oath of George Gurley senior and Thomas Edwards two of the witnesses thereto, and order'd to be recorded and on the motion of the said Executors who made oath according to law, certificate was granted them for obtaining a probat therof in due form giving security Whereupon the said Geo. Gurley with Thomas Edwards his security enter'd into and acknowledg'd their Bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds for the due and faithfull administration on the decedents estate and performance of his will

Order'd that Nathan Vasser John Drake James Story and Thomas Edwards or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Nicholas Gurley and return the appraisement to this court

On the motion of Kinchen Taylor who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of Administration on the estate of William Dun Whereupon the said Kinchen with Miles Cary his security enter'd into and acknowledg'd their Bond in the penalty of one hundred pounds for the due and faithfull administration on the decedents estate

Order'd that Benjamin Warren George Branch Moses Phillips and William Deloach or any three of them do appraise in current money the Slaves if any and personal estate of William Duns and return the appraisement to this court

On the motion of Kinchen Taylor who made oath according to law certificate was granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the estate of James Francis Edward Robins dec'd Whereupon the said Kinchen with Miles Cary his security enter'd into and acknowledg'd his Bond in the penalty of one hundred pounds for the due & faithfull administration on the decedents estate and performance of his will

Order'd that Benjamin Warren George Branch Moses Phillips and William Deloach or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace do appraise in current the slaves if any and personal estate of James Francis Edward Robins
