and the memorandum of livery and seizen thereon order'd were
acknowledg'd by the said Thomas Briggs and order'd to be
recorded

An Indenture of feoffment between James Pedon of the one part
and Jonah Edwards of the other part was proved by the
oaths of William Edwards David Wright and John Wright
witnesses thereto and order'd to be recorded

The last will and Testament of Edward Doyle was presented
in Court by Elizabeth Doyle and Hardy Doyle the Executors
therein named proved by the oaths of Sampson Pitman
and Charles Cosby the witnesses thereto and order'd to be
recorded And on the motion of the said Executor who made
oath according to law certificate was granted him for ob-
taining a probat thereof in due form giving security &c^m
Whereupon the said Elizabeth Doyle with Hardy Doyle
and Sampson Pitman her security's entred into and acknow-
ledg'd their Bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds for
the due and faithfull administration of the decedent's estate
and performance of his will

Order'd that Charles Cosby Edmund Tyler Charles Shields
and Moses Phillips or any three of them being first sworn
before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money
the slaves if any and personal estate of Edward Doyle
and return the appraisement to this Court

On the motion of Sarah Council who made oath according to
law certificate was granted her for obtaining letters of admton
on the estate of Hodges Council Jun^r. Whereupon the said
Sarah with William Bennet and William Denson her se-
curity's entred into and acknowledged their Bonds in the penalty
of Two hundred pounds for the due and faithfull admton
on the decedent's estate

Order'd that Samuel Slade Matt^r Charles Giles Joyner
and William Joyner or any three of them being first sworn
before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money
the slaves if any and personal estate of Hodges Council
Jun^r. and return the appraisement
