This day came as well the ^{Plf} by his atty as the def^t his proper person who confest the Calligation ^{of the said def^t} for four pounds Therefore it is consid^{er}d by the Court that the ^{Plf} recover agst the ^{Def} the said four pounds & his cost by him about his suit in this behalf expended. But this judgement except as to the costs is to be discharg'd by the payment of Forty shillings together with interest from the 23^d Nov^r 1748 till paid Satisfaction acknowledged on this judget for thirteen pence half penny.

On the motion of Aaron Phillips a witness for Taylor at the suit of Washington orderd that the said Taylor pay him twenty five pounds of Tobacco for one days attendance on this Court according to law

On the motion of Jesse Wombwell a witness for Washington agst Taylor orderd that the said Washington pay him twenty five pounds tobacco for one days attendance on this Court according to law
