moned and served with a copy of the presentment and not
appearing on the motion of the jury for our lord the King it is
consider'd by the court that he forfeit and pay to our sovereign
Lord the King the sum of five shillings and that he pay
the costs of this presentment

Robinson for prophane swearing this day came the attorney
for our lord the King and the defendant being duly sum-
moned and served with a copy of the presentment and not
appearing on the motion of the said jury. It is consider'd by
the court that he make his fine with our sovereign lord

wardens of the parish of Stotteray and that he pay the costs
of this presentment
