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discharge thereof or that he the said Mathews will
do it for him whereupon this day came as well
the Plaintiff by his attorney as the defendant in
his proper person who confess'd the Plaintiff claim
for Seventeen pounds fifteen shillings and one half
penny the debt in the declaration mentioned therefor
It is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover
against the said debt Seventeen pounds fifteen
shillings and one half penny and his costs by
him about his suit in this behalf expended
and the said debt in mercy &c.

Witnesses for Bass agst Taylor Ordid that the s.
Bass pay them one hundred and fifty pounds of Tob.
for six days attendance each on this Court accord^g
to law

On the motion of William Kirby a witness for Apple^r
whate agst Brown ordid that the said Apple^r pay
him one hundred and fifty pounds of Tob.^o for
six days attendance on this Court according to law
