

At a Court held for the county of Southampton on Thursday the 13th day of January 1768

An indenture of feoffment between James Wright and Mary his wife of the one part and Joseph Wright of the other part and a memorandum of conveyance thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said James Wright and ordered to be recorded

An inventory and appraisment of the estate of Tabitha Broome decd was returned and ordered to be recorded

Upon the petition of Britain Travis for leave to turn the road near his lands It is Ordered that Joseph Gray Benjamin Puffin and Edwin Gray gent or any 2^d of them do view the convenience and inconvenience attending the same and make report thereof to the court

An indenture of feoffment between Lawrence Smith of the one part and William Turner of the other part was proved by the oaths of John Sutter and James Channell two of the witnesses thereto

An indenture of feoffment between Thomas Hancock and Lucy his wife of the one part and William Barrett of the other part and a receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said Thomas Hancock and ordered to be recorded

Upon the complaint of Charles Davis a free mulatto against Daniel Fisher his master On hearing the parties It is Ordered that the said Charles Davis be removed and that the church wardens of the parish of Nottonay bind out the said Davis according to law

Richard Taylor an infant orphan of Edward Taylor decd this day in court chose Henry Taylor for his guardian whereupon the said Henry Taylor together with Nathaniel Bidley his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £1000 for securing the said orphans estate & indemnifying the court

Phillip Porson an infant orphan of John Porson decd chose Benjamin Porson for his guardian whereupon the said Benjamin Porson together with William Porson his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £1000 for securing the said orphans estate and indemnifying the court

The complaint of Sampson Westbrooke against William Porson is continued till the next court

James Westbrooke orphan of John Westbrooke decd
