Intusrap assault & battery

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and thereupon came also a jury, to wit, John Meadon William Halliman John Boykin George Sumnerrell Joseph Cobb Matthew Boykin Heavensell Howell John Powell Sampson Newson Arthur Vick Benjamin Turner & John Sumnerrell who being sworn diligently to inquire what damages the plaintiff hath sustained by occasion of the intusrap assault & battery in the declaration mentioned upon their oath do say that the plaintiff hath sustained damage by occasion thereof to forty shillings besides his costs therefore It is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant his damages aforesaid in full aforesaid assessed and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended and the said defendant in mercy &c

Ordered that the clerk of this court pay to Judith Porter repⁿ of John Porter due her proportionable part or share of a negro formerly sold by order of this court

On the Motion of Henry Harrison John Morgan Joshua Claud and Phillip Claud witnesses for John Mundall against Groves Sharpe It is Ordered that the said John pay them respectively fifty pounds of each tobacco for two days attendance ^{each of them} on this court according to law

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the court in course

At a Court held for the county of Southampton on Thursday the tenth day of March 1768 Present James Hilday, Charles Dray, Conner Gray & Thomas Bland gent.
An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Simon Turner dec'd was returned and ordered to be recorded

Benjamin Crocker^{gent} produced a licence from the examiners appointed by law to practice as an attorney in the county and other inferior courts of this colony and having taken the usual oaths to his Majesty's person & Government taken and subscribed the abjuration oath and test was sworn and attorney of this court
