Therefore on the Motion of the said plaintiff who proved his demand of three pounds five shillings & six pence and interest on two pounds twelve shillings & six pence part thereof from the 30th day of March 1768 to the time of payment and the said David not now appearing to oppose the said attached effects. It is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said David Johnson the aforesaid debt and interest and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And It is Ordered that the said garnishee satisfy and pay this judgment & costs out of the money in his hands when the same becomes due.

David Chalmer Esq. having obtained an attachment against the estate of David Johnson who hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him for a debt due to the said Chalmer Esq. Charles Cosby gent. Sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said attachment on all the estate of the said David Johnson in the hands of Moses Johnson and that he had summoned him as a garnishee. This day came as well the plaintiff by Edward Fisher their attorney as the said garnishee who being first sworn deposed and said that he will have in his hands a balance after the discharge of a judgment this day obtained by Wm. Boyle agt. the said David Johnson of the estate of the said David. Therefore on the Motion of the said plaintiff who proved their demand of one pound fifteen shillings and one penny and two hundred and eleven pounds of nut tobacco together with interest on twenty shillings part thereof from the 6th day of February 1768 till paid and the said David not now appearing
