This day came the parties by their attorneys & the jury heretofore sworn in this cause came into court and upon their oaths do say that the defendant doth not detain the negro slave in the declaration mentioned in manner and form as the plaintiff against him hath complained thereof. It is considered by the court that the plaintiff take nothing by his bill but for his false clamour be in money &c and that the defendant go free without day and money against the said plaintiff his costs by him about his defence in this behalf expended.

On the Motion of John Edwards a witness for John Whitehead by Nicholas Magit his next friend against Jacob Vick It is Ordered that the said John pay him two hundred and fifty pounds of neat tobacco for ten days attendance on this court.

On the Motion of Aaron Spivey a witness for John Whitehead against Jacob Vick It is Ordered that the said John pay him two hundred and one pounds of neat tobacco for three days attendance on this court and travelling twenty one miles twice and returning.

On the Motion of William Mathews a witness for John Whitehead against Jacob Vick It is Ordered that the said John pay him seven hundred and twenty nine pounds of neat tobacco for nine days attendance on this court and travelling twenty one miles eight times and returning according to law.

On the Motion of Benjamin Denson a witness for Jacob Vick at the suit of John Whitehead It is Ordered that the said Jacob pay him four hundred and seventy five pounds of neat tobacco for nineteen days attendance on this court.

On the Motion of Mary Denson & Richard Vick witnesses for Jacob Vick at the suit of John Whitehead It is Ordered that the said Jacob pay them
