Moses Bennett a prisoner for breach of the peace & Joseph Gray his security acknowledged themselves indebted to our lord the King in twenty pounds each of their respective goods & chattels lands and tenements to be lived and to our lord the King his heirs and assigns rendered Yet upon this condition that if the said Moses Bennett shall be of good behaviour to all his majesty's liege people but more especially towards Lucy Bennett his wife for the space of three calendar months then this recognizance to be void

A Court held at the courthouse of Southampton county on Thursday the eighth day of December 1768 on the examination of William Jones otherwise Chapman for housestealing

The above named William Jones otherwise Chapman being committed to the goal of this county charged with the felony of feloniously stealing one grey gelding of the price of £ the property of William Vick was led to the bar & thereupon deposed witnesses to wit, William Vick Benjamin Fyus Buwells Williamson and John Clacke were sworn and examined upon the premises and the prisoner heard in his own defence Upon consideration of the evidence of the said witnesses & the circumstances of the case It is the opinion of the court that the said William Jones otherwise Chapman ought to be tried for the said fact at the next general court to be held at the capital in Williamsburg in April next and thereupon he is remanded to goal
