On the Motion of Elizabeth Woden widow and executrix of Joseph Woden dec'd who made oath according to her certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of adm'n on the said decedent's estate - giving security whereupon the said Elizabeth together with Nathaniel Norwell his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of £500 for the said Elizabeth due and faithful adm'n on the said decedent's estate

Ordered that William Blunt John Blunt John Sturgeon and John Danson or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any & personal estate of Joseph Woden dec'd & return the appraisement to the court

Ordered that the court be adjourned till tomorrow morning 10 O'clock
