 one rug one dutch blanket one table one chest one spinning
 wheel two pots and spoons two pewter basins one dish thirteen
 plates one narrow and one looking glass one pair of cords one
 wading hoe one hammer one quart mugg two dishes and two
 chairs This day came the plaintiff by Edward Astor their
 attorney and the said Thomas Bland not now appearing to satisfy
 the said attached effects on the motion of the said plaintiff who
 proved their demand of seven pounds four shillings and one
 pence to be just It is considered by the court That they were
 against the said Thomas Bland the said seven pounds four
 shillings and one pence and their costs by him in this
 behalf expended William Glover a garnisher appeared and
 being first sworn deposed that he hath in his hands the sum of
 eight shillings of the said Blands estate whereupon It is ordered
 that he pay the same to the plaintiff towards satisfaction of this
 judgment And It is further ordered that the sheriff sell the
 aforesaid attached effects at public auction for ready money
 and therewith discharge the aforesaid judgment or so much
 thereof as the sale shall amount to and the costs of this suit
 and that he also return an account of his proceedings herein
 to the court

Giles Symon having obtained an attachment against the estate of
 Thomas Bland who hath privately removed himself or so aboves that
 the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him for a debt
 due to the said Giles Hardy before a constable for this country now
 made return that he had executed the said attachment on all the
 corn in the crib eight sheats three sows and ten tier barrels of
 the estate of the said Thomas Bland This day came the said
 Giles Symon and the said Thomas Bland not appearing ^{touther} the said
 attached effects on the motion of the said Giles who proved his
 demand of one pound seventeen shillings and six pence to be just
 It is considered by the court that the said Giles Symon recover against
 the said Thomas Bland the said one pound seventeen shillings
 and six pence and his costs by him in this behalf expended
 whereupon It is Ordered that the sheriff sell the aforesaid
 attached effects for ready money and therewith discharge the
 aforesaid judgment and costs and if any residue remain that
 he pay the same to David Chalmers Esq: towards discharging
 a judgment this day returned by the said Chalmers Esq: against the
 said Bland and that he return an account of his proceeding herein
 to the court
