

Charles Crosby gent Sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said attachment on the estate of the said Thomas Bland in the hands of William Glover and Giles Jeyner and also on the following effects to wit, two feather beds & bedsteads one rug one Dutch blanket one table one chest one spinning wheel two pots and trunks two furter buttons one dish thirteen plates one narrow and one looking glass one pair of cards one wedding hoe one hammer one quart mugg two dishes & two chairs This day came the plaintiff by Edward Thistler their attorney and the said Thomas Bland not now appearing to uphold the said attached effects On the Motion of the said plaintiff's attorney proved their demand of seven pounds four shillings and one penny to be just It is considered by the court that they recover against the said Thomas Bland the said seven pounds four shillings and one penny and their costs by them in this behalf expended William Glover a garnishee appeared and being first sworn deposed that he hath in his hands the sum of eight shillings of the said Bland's estate whereupon It is ordered that he pay the same to the plaintiffs towards satisfaction of this judgment And It is further ordered that the sheriff sell the aforesaid attached effects at public auction for ready money and therewith discharge the aforesaid judgment or so much thereof as the sale shall amount to and the costs of this suit and that he also return an account of his proceedings herein to the court

Giles Jeyner having obtained an attachment against the estate of Thomas Bland who hath privately removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him for a debt due to the said Giles Hardy for a constable for this county now made return that he had executed the said attachment on all the corn in the crib eight sheaves three sows and ten ter barrels of the estate of the said Thomas Bland This day came the said Giles Jeyner and the said Thomas Bland not appearing to uphold the said attached effects on the Motion of the said Giles who proved his demand of one pound seventeen shillings and six pence to be just It is considered by the court that the said Giles Jeyner recover against the said Thomas Bland the said one pound seventeen shillings and six pence and his costs by him in this behalf expended and whereupon It is ordered that the sheriff sell the aforesaid attached effects for ready money and therewith discharge the aforesaid judgment and costs and if any overplus remain that he pay the same to David Chalmer Esq. towards discharging a judgment this day obtained by the said Chalmer Esq. against the said Bland and that he also return an account of his proceedings herein to the court
