In Debt

This day came as well the plaintiff by Richard Baker his attorney as the defendant in his proper person who confessed the plaintiffs action for fifty three pounds nine shillings and nine pence the debt is the declaration mentioned. It is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said fifty three pounds nine shillings and nine pence and his costs by him about the suit in this behalf expended and the said defendant in mercy. But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of twenty six pounds fourteen shillings and ten pence half penny together with interest for the same from the eighth day of June 1768 to the time of payment

On the Motion of John Hatfield who made oath according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of his deceased wife Elizabeth Hatfield giving security whereupon the said John together with Simon Woodward his security entered into and acknowledged his bond in the penalty of £200 for the said John Hatfield due admin<sup>r</sup> of the said decedents estate

Peter Thorne one of the executors of Timothy Thorne dec'd deposed he could not assist such trust and refused to qualify

Upon the petition of Lemuel Kiddick against William Alder for one pound eleven shillings and three pence due by account This day came <sup>as well</sup> the said Lemuel Kiddick by Edward Fisher his attorney as the said defendant in his proper person who confessed the allegation of the said petition to be true. Whereupon It is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover ag<sup>t</sup> the said defendant the said one pound eleven shillings and three pence his costs by him in this behalf expended
