Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the Defendant the said six pounds fourteen shillings & six pence & his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended & the said defendant in mercy. But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of one pound eighteen shillings & six pence with interest from the 3^d day of November 1767 till paid.

The petition of Thomas Fisher against Wm Boon is dismissed being agreed by the parties.

Upon the petition of John Covitt against Geo. Lawrence & Chas. Lawrence for two pounds five shillings & interest or eleven pounds from Jan^y. 1767 till paid due by note. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney & the defendant having been duly summoned & served with a copy of the petition & not appearing. On the motion of the said plaintiff it is considered by the Court that he recover against the S. defendant the said two pounds five shillings & interest or eleven pounds from Jan^y. 1767 & his costs by him ^{also his costs} in this behalf expended.
