The arbitrators to whom the determination of all differences between the parties was submitted by rule of this court of the last this day returned their awards in confirmation of which it is considered by the court that the parties pay of them ^{their} respective costs by them in this behalf sustained

Upon the petition of John George Wills against William Glover for two pounds due by account This day came the parties by their attorneys who being fully heard it is considered by the court that the petition be dismissed & that the plaintiff pay unto the defendant his costs

On the motion of Jeremiah Pearce a witness for John Geo. Wills against William Glover it is ordered that the said Wills pay him one hundred & forty five pounds of Tobacco for one days attendance on this court & travelling forty miles & returning according to law
