This day came as well the
 plaintiff by his attorney as the defendant in his proper person who con-
 fessed the plaintiff's action for one hundred pounds the debt in the decla-
 ration mentioned Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff
 recover against the said defendant the said sum of one hundred pounds
 the debt in the declaration mentioned & his costs by him about his suit
 in this behalf expended & the said defendant in money &c But this
 judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of
 forty three pounds eight shillings & ten pence & interest from the thirteenth
 day of February 1769 till paid

Upon the petition of Isaac Williams ^{vs of Dan Williams} against Thomas Grewitt for two pounds
 two shillings & five pence due by account This day came as well the plaintiff
 by his attorney as the defendant in his proper person who faith that
 he cannot gainsay the allegation of the said petition as to one pound sixteen
 shillings & five pence Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff it is con-
 sidered that he recover against the said defendant the said sum of one pound
 sixteen shillings & five pence & his costs by him in this behalf expended

Upon the petition of Isaac Williams against Jacob Turner for one pound
 sixteen shillings due by note of hand This day came the plaintiff by his
 attorney & the defendant having been duly summoned & served with a copy
 of the petition & not appearing On the motion of the plaintiff it is considered
 that he recover against the said defendant the said sum of one pound sixteen shillings
 & interest from 29th August 1768 till paid — Mem^o the said acknowledges satis-
 faction for 7/16 paid aut. 2. 1769
