returned whereupon it is ordered that the treasurer of this county pay
Richard Richs fifteen pounds one shilling for the repairs

Ordered that Rich^d Killo treasurer of this county pay Thomas
Richs two pounds eight shillings & six pence for repairing the
prison

This day came the parties by their attorneys
whereupon came also a jury to wit William Halliman John Johnson
Barnaby Drake John Pope Thomas Wills John Beale Jeph^t Warble
Job Wright George Washington James Rich Richard Pirley Jeph^t Drake
who being elected tried & sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined
the lessee of the plaintiff offered in evidence to the jury to support the
issue in his behalf a writing purporting the last will & testament
of Thomas Underwood deceased which was opposed by the
defendants attorney alleging that the same was not proved & certi-
fied as the law directs & by the court such deed was denied to be
given in evidence whereupon the jury answered upon their oaths after
said do say that the defendants are not guilty in manner & form as the
plaintiff against them in pleading hath alleged Therefore it is con-
sidered by the court that the plaintiff take nothing by his bill but
his salu^r clamor be in mercy &c & the defendants go thereof home
without day & recover against the lessee of the plaintiff their costs
by them about their suit in this behalf expended from which judgment
the lessee of the plaintiff prayed an appeal to the eighth day of the next
general court which was granted him giving security as the Law
directs

An Indenture of Giftment between Samuel Holden & Martha
his wife of the one part & George Penant of the other part together
with a memorandum of livery of seisin & receipt thereon endorsed
were acknowledged by the Abso^t Samuel Holden & having been
