Ordered that Charles Corby & Richard Wells do view a bridge over Round Hill & make report whether the same is done according to the agreement entered into by the undertakers

An Indenture of settlement between Osborne Branch of the one part and Charles Briggs of the other part was proved by the oaths of Rich^d P. B. Benja^m Clifton Just^s & William Hines the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded

The attachment formerly awarded against the estate of the ^d defendant being returned executed This day came the plaintiff by his attorney & the defendant being solemnly called & not appearing on the motion of the ^d plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that he recover against the ^d defendant twenty one pounds eight shillings & six pence & his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended & the said defendant in money &c But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of ten pounds nineteen shillings & three pence & interest from the twenty fourth day of June one thousand seven hundred & eighty nine till the time of payment

William Bynum who was formerly appointed to inspect the package of Beef Pork &c this day appeared & was sworn according to Law

Upon the Petition of Richard Hamlin against John Ray &c for dealing with & on a negro slave contrary to the act of assembly This day came the parties by their attorneys who being fully heard it is considered by the Court that the ^d Petition be dismissed
