The persons appointed to sell & divide the slaves and personal estate of William Cooper died this day returned their report in the words following to wit: In obedience to and order of the court of Southampton county bearing date the 13th day of October 1769 to us James Brown & Abudgton Jones deputed to sell the slaves of William Cooper died on six months credit & the money arising thereon to equally divide between Benjamin Hatfield in right of Lucy his wife John Hatfield in right of Elizabeth his wife James Cooper Sally Cooper Ann Cooper non Charles Woodards wife & Martha Cooper We did according to that decree order sell the said slaves to wit George a boy to Sally Cooper for thirty pounds Jack a boy to Benjamin Hatfield for twenty pounds seven shillings wench Cherry to John Hardgrove for fifty seven pounds thirteen shillings Phillis a child to Rever Barker for twelve pounds & Prosperus Silvio a child to D^r for eleven pounds four shillings & six pence fellow Pompey to Abraham Mitchell for thirty two pounds thirteen shillings amounting in the whole to one hundred & sixty one pounds six shillings eight pence and have divided the same equally the rest of the said estate was not to be had as since the death of the said William Cooper his widow hath had
