may be taken & Whereupon the plaintiff prays the writ
of our lord the King to the sheriff of this county to be
directed to cause him to have his possession of his
term aforesaid yet to come & to him it is granted

This day came the parties by their
attorneys and thereupon came also a jury to wit Arthur
Dick John Bradley Joseph Roper Benjamin Williams
Benjamin Newsum Benjamin Barnes Robert Newsum
Isiah Johnson Isaac Williams Benjamin Waller Richard
Johnson & John Gray who being elected tried and sworn the
Oath to speak upon their oath do say that the defendant
hath paid five pounds eight shillings and four pence
part of the Debt in the declaration mentioned Therefore it
is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against
the said defendant the sum of thirteen pounds nineteen
shillings and his costs by him about his suit in this
behalf expended & the s^d Debt in money But this
judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the
Payment of One pound eleven and two pence and interest
to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum
from the sixth day of May 1769 till paid
