of our lord the King to the Sheriff of their county to be
directed to cause him to have his possession of his
term aforesaid Yet to come by to him it is granted

Johnson & John Gray who being elected tried and from the
truth to speak upon their oath do say that the defendant
hath paid five pounds eight shillings and four pence
part of the debt in the declaration mentioned Therefore it
is considered by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against
the said defendant the sum of thirteen pounds nineteen
shillings and his costs by him about his suit in this
behalf expended of the debt in sumable But this
judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the
Payment of One pound eleven and two pence and interest
to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum
from the fifth day of may 1769 till Paid
