The last will and testament of Francis Denson was presented in court by Elizabeth Denson Sarah Denson & Ann Denson the executors therein named and proved by the solemn affirmation of Thomas Draper and Jesse Draper being of the People called Quakers / two of the witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded And on the motion of the J. Executives who made affirmation according to Law Certificate was granted them for obtaining letters of Administration on the estate of the said deceased giving security whereupon the J. Executives together with James Jordan Scott Clerk Thomas Draper their Secutaries entered into and acknowledged their bond in the Penalty of One thousand Pounds for the J. Execs due and faithful administration on the Estate of the said deceased & Performance of his Will

Ordered that John Johnson Elias Herring John Jaynes & Henry Jaynes or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace do appraise in current money the slaves and Personal estate of Francis Denson and return the Appraisement to Court

For Reasons appearing to the Court Laganus Johnson is exempted from Payment of Service during his disability

An Indenture of Apprentice between Richard Blom & Mary his wife of the one part and John Thomas Blom of the other part with a receipt thereon endorsed was acknowledged by the aforesaid
