 " of the Afsamorsack bridge We did meet at the place afore
 " said and did then and there let the repairs of the same
 " to William Simmons who undertook the same for the sum
 " of Nineteen pounds thirteen shillings and nine pence
 (Error. see The Margins)

An Indenture of Coffment between John Seth and
 Elizabeth his Wife of the one part and John Ray of
 the other part was acknowledged by the said John &
 Elizabeth, (she being first privately examin'd as the
 Law directs) and order'd to be recorded.

A Deed of Gift from Henry Coker to Nathaniel Coker
 was acknowledged by the said Henry Coker and order'd
 to be recorded.

A Deed of Gift from Henry Coker to Jonathan Coker
 was acknowledged by the said H^y. Coker and order'd to
 be recorded

A Deed of Gift from Henry Coker to Mary Coker was
 acknowledged by the said Hen^y. Coker and order'd to be
 recorded

Thomas Moore who being sworn and examin'd inform'd
 the Court that since the last Court John Adams Thomas
 Jarrell Ben Clifton have been guilty of unlawfull gaming
 at his Ordinary Whereupon it is order'd by the Court
 that the said John Adams Ben Clifton and Thomas
 Jarrell severally make their fines with our Sovereigns
 Lord the King by the payment of Five pounds each to the use
 of the parish of Nottoway agreeable to an act of Assembly
 in that case made and provided and that they severally
 pay costs Whereupon John Adams with Benjamin
 Ruffen Jun^r his Security ^{James Barnes for} Tho^s Jarrell an infant Ben
 Clifton with Jesse Clifton his Security came into Court
 and severally acknowledged themselves indebted to our Lord
 the King that is to say John Adams James Barnes
 for Thomas Jarrell and Benjamin Clifton in the sum
 of Twenty pounds each and the said Security's Ten
 pounds each of their respective lands & Tenements goods
 and Chattles to our said Lord the King his heirs and suc
 cessors render'd. It upon this condition that if the
 said John Adams Tho^s Jarrell and Benjamin Clifton
 be of good behaviour towards our Sovereign Lord the King
