

An Indenture of feoffment between Henry Dope and Anne his wife of the one part and Richard Worrell of the other part with a receipt thereon endos'd were acknowledg'd by Henry Dope party thereto and order'd to be recorded and Anne the wife of the said Henry personally appears in court and being first privately examin'd as the law directs voluntarily relinquish'd her right of dowers in the said estate convey'd by the said Indenture.

The last will and testament of John Skines was presented in court by Elizabeth Skines the Executrix therein named and proved by the oaths of John Browne and William Foster two of the witnesses thereto and order'd to be recorded And on the motion of the said Executrix who made oath according to Law a certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security whereupon &c. the said Executrix with Richard Skines and John Skines his security enter'd into and acknowledg'd their Bond in the penalty of Five Hundred pounds for the said Elizabeth due and faithfull administration of the estate of the said John Skines and performance of the will.

Order'd that William Foster John Kirby Jun^r Simmons Executrix of Charles and Jesse Anington or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of peace do appraise in current money the Slaves if any and personal estate of John Skines and return the appraisement to Court.

On the petition of Francis Eppes Guardian of Will^t Eppes orphan of Edward Eppes for letters of admⁿ on the estate of George Eppes Order'd that Robert Batte his admⁿ be summon'd to shew cause why his letters of administration should not be revoked according to the prayer of the plaintiff.

The last will and testament of Thomas Marks was presented in court by Richard Worrell and William Mackie the Exors therein named proved by the oaths of Francis Rose Charity Spivy and William Spivy son of Aaron the witnesses thereto and order'd to be recorded and on the motion of the said Exors who made oath according to Law certificate was granted
