An Indenture of feoffment between John Pope and ^{Martha} Prudence his wife of the one part and Benjamin Baker of the other part were acknowledged by the within named John Pope & Martha his wife and order'd to be recorded she having been first privately examin'd as the law directs.

The last Will and Testament of John Simmons formerly proved by one Witness was further proved by one Witness was further proved by the oath of Ann Bland formerly Ann Gray William Andrews and Peter Butts being sworn deposed that they were acquainted with the hand writing of the s.^d Simmons and believed the s.^d Will was wholly wrote by the said testator & the motion of William Simmons is order'd to be recorded.

William Andrews foreman, Joshua Wood Ben^e Warren, John Summerell, James Summerell, Nathan Crocker, William Dehaach Rice Peice, Isaac William John Johnson, Nicholas Morris, Thomas Crenshaw John Ivys William Francis Robert Laurence William Turner & James Lundy were sworn a grand jury of inquest on the body of this County and having received their charge were sent out of Court and after some time returned and presented as follows

"one, we present William Skines Sheriff for profane swearing the 22nd day of April 1772 We also
