An Indenture of feoffment between David Benson and  
Judah his wife of the one part and James Councill of  
the other part with a receipt thereon endos'd were ack-  
nowledg'd by the above David Benson and Judah his  
wife she being first privately examin'd as the law direct  
and order'd to be record'd

The last will and Testament of John Dope was proven  
by the oath of William Williams one of the Witnesses  
thereto and on the 14<sup>th</sup> May 1772 on the motion of Dr  
Turner husband of Sarah Turner the executrix therein  
named the said will is order'd to be record'd and on  
the said Joseph Turners making oath according to  
Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a pro-  
bat hereof giving security Whereupon the said  
Joseph Turner with Richard Beale his security  
came into court and acknowledged their Bond in  
the penalty of Two Thousand Pounds for the said  
Joseph due as a faithfull administration of the  
estate of the said John Dope and the performance  
of his will

Order'd that Job Wright, William Williams Rich-  
ard Beale son of Richard & Bridgeman Joyner or any  
three of them of them do appraise, in current money the  
Slaves if any and personal estate of John Dope dec'd  
and return the appraisement to Court
