Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff taking nothing by his suit his false claim be in money &c. and the defendant go therefore hence without day recover against the said plaintiff his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended.

On the motion of Shester Carr and William Berrill Witnesses for Mary Surley against Stephen Williamson Ordered that the said Mary pay to the said Shester one hundred and eighty three pounds of Tobacco for three days attendance on this court and travelling thirty six miles and the said William Four Shundred and forty four lbs of Tobacco for seven days attendance on this court and travelling eighteen miles first times according to law

Ordered that the Court be adjourn'd till to morrow 10^o Clock
