auction for ready money and therewith discharge
the judgement and on so much thereof as the sale
shall amount to and return an acc^t of his pro-
ceedings to the next court

This day came the par-
ties by their attorneys and thereupon came also
a jury to wit, John Garner, Thomas Cronshaw,
Hamwood Comer, Jacob Summerell, William Guball,
Lewis Soyner, Edm^d Wilson, John Fergusson,

Slade and Thomas Stephenson who being elect-
ed true and sworn the truth to speak upon the
issue join'd were sent out court to con-
sult of their verdict.

It appearing to the court that Joshua Savory
hath been guilty of a trespass and breach of
the peace in killing a steer the property of
Nath^l Byrd Order'd that the said Savory
find security for his good behaviour and also
to answer an indictment to be preferred agst
him at November court and not to depart
without the leave of this court.

Whereupon the said Savory with William
Bynum his security acknowledged & themselves
severally indented to our Lord the king that
is to say the said Savory in the sum of Twenty
pounds and his security in the sum of Ten p^{cs}
to be levied on their respective lands and ten-
ements goods and chattels to our Lord the king
his heirs and successors sendeid. Yet upon
this condition that the said Savory shall be
of good behaviour towards the peace of our
sovereign Lord the king and all his liege
