This day came the parties by their attorneys and thereupon came also a jury to wit James Slack, John Gardner, John Blow, John Davis, Sr., Long Josiah Johnson, Lewis Soyner, Jos^{ph} Wright, James Booth, Robert Bittle and Edward Wyndham who being elected try's and sworn the truth to speak upon themselves join'd to say that the plaintiff hath not p^d the debt in the declaration mentioned and they do assess the plaintiff damages by reason thereof to be Thirty six pounds Twelve Shillings Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said sum of Thirty six pounds twelve shillings and his costs by him in his suit in this behalf expended and the said defendant in mercy But this judgement except as to the cost is to be discharged by the payment of Eighteen pounds six shilling together with interest from the 15 day of Feb^r 1769 till paid.
