

The last will and testamēt of Sampson Turner
 was presented in court by Celia Turner one of the
 Executors therin named the other executor in court
 refusing to join in the probat proved by the oaths
 of Thomas Stephenson and Benjamin Swanson
 two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be re-
 corded And on the motion of the mother of the
 said Celia who made oath according to Law cer-
 tificate was granted her for obtaining a probate
 in due form Whereupon the said Celia Turner
 with Stephen Williamson and Joseph Brithall
 acknowledging their Bona in the penalty of five
 Thousand pounds for the due and faithfull adminis-
 tration of the decedents estate and performance
 of his will.

Ordered that John Clayton Joseph Dales John
 Summerell and Richard Manning or any three of
 them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do
 appraise in current money the slaves of any and
 personal estate of ^{deceased} Turner and return the appraisements
 to this court

An Indenture of feoffment between Henry Debony
 of the one part and Joseph Simmons of the other part
 and the memorandum of levity and seisin thereon
 made were provd by the oaths of Edw and Taylor
 and John Royal two of the witnesses thereto and
 at a Court held the 10th December the said Inden-
 ture and memorandum further proved by the
 oaths of Henry Taylor another witness thereto
 and ordered to be recorded

An Indenture of feoffment between Joseph Griffin
 and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and William
 Stans of the other part was proved by the oaths of
 John Clayton and William Gray two of the witnesses
 thereto and on the 10th December 1772 was further proved
 by the oath of John Clark another witness thereto and
 ordered to be recorded

An Indenture of feoffment between Matthew
 Johnson of the one part and Benjamin Barnes of the
 other part and the memorandum thereon made
 were acknowledged by the within named Matthew
 Johnson party thereto and ordered to be recorded
