Gentlemen
James Day Rector Sheriff of this county now made return that he had executed the said attachment in the hands of Samy Cottin and summon'd him as garnisher. This day came the said party who being sworn deposed that he had in his hands of the estate of the defendant the following effects to wit 10d Box talk 2 Shillings 1 pence short 1 guinea being his (hitting has) twelveth day before last having known a hole 1 Raze and a half and his costs. Therefrom the motion of the said P^rf. who upon oath made his demand to be paid and the def. not appearing to satisfy the same effects. This concurred by the court that he recover agst the said defendant the sum of seven pds fifteen shillings and ten pence and his cost by him in his suit on this behalf expended. Order'd that the Sheriff sell the aforesaid effects at public auction for ready money and otherwise discharge the judgment & costs or so much thereof as the sale shall amount to and return an account of his proceeding to the next court.

The last will and testament of Robert Johnson was presented in Court by Council Johnson one of the executors therin named and proved by the oaths of Joseph Brasheam and Harry Doyle two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Executor who made, made oath according to law certific'd, is granted him for obtaining a probate thereto in due form giving security Whereupon the said Council Johnson with Harry Doyle and John Morris his security acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand a pound for the due and faithful administration of the exec's estate and a performance of his will.

Ordered that Edmund Tyler Sampson citizen Jonathan and John Council or any three of them do appraise on ^{being put to the town of} current money the slaves if any and personal estate Robert Johnson deceased & return the appraisement to Court.
