This day came the attorney for our Lord the King and the defendant having been duly summoned and served with a copy of the presentment and not appearing on the motion, of the said attorney for our Lord the King it is considered by the court that the said Joshua pay unto the Church Wardens of the parish of St. Lukes twenty shillings according to the act of assembly in that case made and provided, and that he also pay the cost of the presentment.

Upon the presentment of the Grand Jury against Joshua Claud jun^r for riotous and disorderly behavior this day came the attorney for our Lord the King & the defendant having been duly summoned and served with a copy of the presentment and not appearing on the motion, of the said attorney for our Lord the King it is considered by the court that said Joshua pay unto the Church Wardens of St. Lukes (see the following).

Upon the presentment of the Grand Jury against Joshua Claud jun^r for riotous behavior the defendant in his proper person comes into court and saith that he will not contend with our Lord the King of and upon the premises nor but that he is guilty in manner and form as against him in the said presentment is alleged. Therefore it is considered by the court he make his fees without Lord, the King by the payment of six pence to and for the use of the government and the contingent charges thereof and the said defendant pay the cost of this prosecution and find security for his good behavior. Whereupon the said Joshua Claud with John Almdale his security came into court and acknowledged themselves indebted to our Lord the King that is to say the said Joshua in the sum of Twenty pounds and the said Almdale in the sum of Ten pounds of their respective goods and chattels to be delivered to our Lord the King his heirs and successors and render it yet upon this condition, that the said Joshua shall be of good behavior towards the peace of our Sovereign Lord the King and all his lieges subjects for the space of 12 calendar months from this time, then this recognizance, to be void.
