Upon the petition of Richard Worrell and William Mackie & Esqrs of Thomas Marks dec'd against John Oberly and Josiah Johnson for two pounds four shillings and five pence due by note this day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being duly served with a copy of the petition and not appearing on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said two pounds four shillings and five pence to be discharge by the payment of one pound two shillings and two pence half penny and his costs by them in their suit in this behalf expended together with interest from the 1st May 1772 till paid.

Ordered that Cordall Worrell, John Williamson, William Byrnes and Nathan Thrust or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of peace do appraise in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of Robert Williams dec'd and return the appraisement to court.

Elias Storring v. C. Pitt { In debt

The defendants being arrested and not appearing on the motion of the Pitt by their attorney it is considered that judgment be entered for the plaintiff against the said Pitt and Thomas Rialy their security unless they appear and plead at the next court.

Upon the petition of Elias Storring v. C. against Samuel Sandyford for three pounds fourteen shillings and ten pence due by note this day came the plaintiff by their attorney and the defendant having been duly served with a copy of the petition and not appearing on the motion of the plaintiff by their attorney it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said three pounds fourteen shillings and ten pence and their costs by them in their suit in this behalf expended together with interest from the 22nd February 1772 till paid.
