attorneys and thereupon came also a jury to wit,
William Francis, William Selth, William Foster Rice,
Bolton Pierce, Samuel Slade, Moses Phillips and
Pope, Jacob Barnes, John Summerell, John Thomas
Blow, Henry Biddle, and James Nash who being
elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the
issue joint upon their oath do say that the defend-
ant did not assume upon himself in manner and form
as the plaintiff against him hath complaint. There-
fore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff
take nothing by his bill but his false clamor becom-
mer of &c. and the defendant go therefore hence
without day and recover against the said plain-
tiff his cost by him about his suit in this behalf
expended.

An Indenture of agreement between Thomas
Williamson and William Verghart of the one part
and William Verghart of the other part was acknow-
ledged by Thomas Williamson, and William
Verghart the parties thereto and order'd to be re-
corded.

Ordered that the treasurer pay Richard Sharpe
nine pounds for the repairs of Black creek bridge
