Elizabeth Claud widow of Philip Claud declared in Court she would not accept the legacies by his will but to renounce the same.

An Acco^t Current of the estate of Joseph Snyder was this day returned by the persons appointed to settle the same and order'd to be recorded.

An Indenture of feoffment between James Evans of the one part and John Clayton of the other part with a memorandum of Levy & Seizen and the receipt thereon indors'd was proved by the oaths of William Urquhart John Andrews & George Andrews witnesses thereto and order'd to be recorded.
