

Ordain that the churchwardens of the parish of St Lukes find out a nancy boy a poor child of annuity according to law

The last will of Charity Burnall was presented in court by John Blunt Executor herein named and proved by the oath of Alexander Watson one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Blunt who made oath according to law certifiat was granted them for obtaining a probat thereof giving security Whereupon the said John Blunt with William Blunt his security entered into and acknowledge their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds for the due and faithfull administration on the decedents & performance of his will.

Ordain that John Suter Thomas Suter Ambrose Grizard and William Turner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of peace to receive in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of Charity Burnall and make report thereof to this court

John Hay Esq^r having obtained an attachment against the estate of John Bigby who hath privately removed or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him which cause having been left of the docket by mistake is now ordered to be replaced and the Sheriff having made return that he had executed the said attachment on sundry effects liable to preceding attachments which the said Bigby hath now appears to replevy Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant Twenty five pounds pounds five shillings together with interest on the same from the 27th Augth 1772 till p^{nt} & then cost by them about their suit in this behalf expended Ordain that the Sheriff discharge the same after satisfying the judgment obtained by James Hay Esq^r against the estate of the said Bigby.
