

Ordered that the churchwardens of the parish of St Lukes bind unto Nancy Sny a poor child of Ann Bay according to law.

The last will of Charity Burnall was presented in court by John Blunt Executor therin named and proved by the oath of Alexander Watson one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Blunt who made oath according to law certificat was granted them for obtaining a probat therof giving security Whereupon the said John Blunt with William Blunt his security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds for the due and faithfull administration on the accedents & performance of his will.

Ordered that John Sutten Thomas Sutten Ambrose Grizade and William Turner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of peace do pay & paye in current money the slaves if any in personal estate of Charity Burnall and make report therof to this court.

John Day & Co having obtained an attachment against the estate of John Bigby who hath privately removed or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him which cause having been left of the dockett by mistake is now order'd to be replaced and the Sheriff having made return that he had executed the said attachment on sundry effects liable to preceding attachments which the said Bigby hath now now appear'd to reply therefore on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is consider'd by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant Twenty five pounds pounds ffeig shillings together with interest on the same from the 27th Aug^t 1772 till p^r & their cost by them about their suit in this behalf expended Ordered that the Sheriff discharge the same after satisfying the judgment obtain'd by James Day Risley against the estate of the said Bigby.
