On the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney  
and by virtue of the act of assembly on that case  
made and provided the said defendant having  
had legal notice hereof execution is awarded the  
plaintiff against the said defendant for Eleven  
pounds three shillings and three pence halfpenny with  
interest from the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1773 till the  
time of payment according to the condition of the  
Bond aforesaid & for his costs by him in this behalf  
expended.

On the motion of Thomas Ridley a witness for  
John Stay & C<sup>r</sup> against Elizabeth Gray ordered that  
the said Stay & C<sup>r</sup> pay him twenty five pounds of  
tobacco for one day's attendance on this court accord-  
ing to law

On the petition of David Stines he is allowed to keep  
an ordinary at his plantation on the road leading  
to Taylors bridge in this county for one year from  
this term giving security whereupon the said Stines  
with Joshua Claude Jr. inter alia into and acknowledged  
their bond in the penalty of fifty pounds for his  
keeping the said ordinary according to law & His  
order that the clerk of this office prepare a licence  
for him accordingly

An Indenture of agreement between Lydia Butts &  
Lydia her wife of the one part & Jasco Turner of the  
other part and the receipt thereon endorsed was acknow-  
ledged by the said Lydia Butts & Lydia his wife  
she being first privately examined as the law directs  
and sworn to be recorded
