The prisoner was set to the bar and arraigned of the said offence and pleaded guilty the court being doubtful whether they ought to proceed to judgment of death against the said slave for the offence aforesaid take time till Monday the 6th day of June next and the court adjourned till that day and it is ordered that the said slave be remanded to goal A. Jones
