Lukes for the use of the said parish upon this condition that the said Joshua Johnson shall perform the orders of the court relative to the maintenance of the aforesaid bastard child Whereupon it is ordered that the said Joshua Johnson pay to the churchwardens of the parish of S. Lukes £4 for the 2 succeeding years for the support of the said Bastard child and three pound for each succeeding year till bound out.

An Indenture of feoffment between John Booth of the one part and Charles Briggs Esq^r of the other part was proved by the oaths of George Nicholson and John Key two of the witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded and on the 11th day of May 1775 this Indenture was further proved by the oath of Nathaniel Briggs.
