Whereupon it is decreed and ord'red that the defendants retain the sum of five pounds three shillings and one penny the defendants proportion of the child's part in the bill that the sum of Seventy seven pounds six shillings and six pence the balance of the sale of the negro be equally divided between the complainants and that the sum be confirmed as laid off by the report. The costs of this suit to be equally born by both parties.

An Indenture of f'offment between James Moore and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and James Bradley of the other part and the memorandum of living and dying therein made were acknowledg'd by the said James Moore and Elizabeth his wife parties thereto she being first privately examined as the law directs and order'd to be recorded.

An Indenture of f'offment between John Bradley & of the one part and James Moore of the other part and the memorandum of living and dying were acknowledged by the said John Bradley and Mary his wife party thereto she being first privately examined as the law directs and order'd to be recorded.

On the motion of William Pope who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Joseph Pope wherein the said William Pope with John Thomas Blow his security entered into and acknowledged his Bond for the penalty of two hundred pounds for the due and faithful administration on the decedent's estate.

Order'd that Thomas Edwards Edmund Day Richard Blow and Israel Swynor or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace to apprise on conveniently the slaves of any and personal estate of Joseph Pope and return the appraisement to this court.

Xx Joseph and William Scott having obtained an attachment against the estate of Joseph Johnson who hath privately removed himself so abscornes that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him for a debt due from the said Johnson to the said Scotts.
