William Blunt and Elias Herring gentlemen formerly justices of the
peace for this county this day took the oath of justices of the peace for
the county as prescibed by a late ordinance of the general Assembly
of the commonwealth of Virginia

Upon the petition of Henry Taylor for leave to erect a water grist mill over
a marsh land in this county setting forth that he hath lands on one side
of the said creek opposite to the lands of John Bitman &
praying for an acre of the said Bitman land for the purpose aforesaid
Ordered that the Sheriff summon a jury of twelve freeholders of the
vicinage to meet upon the said lands and that they being sworn before
a justice of the peace or the said sheriff do diligently view & examine
the said land & the lands adjacent thereto on both sides the run of the
creek & it may be affected or laid under water by building such
mill together with the timber and other conveniences thereon that
they report the same with the true value of the acre petitioned for
the damages to the party holding the same or to any other person or
persons to the next court under their hands & seals

Upon the petition of John Allerton for leave to erect a water grist mill
on the Tidewater in this county setting forth that he hath lands
on one side of the said swamp opposite to the lands of John Person
and praying for an acre of the said lands Ordered that the Sheriff
summon a jury of twelve freeholders of vicinage to meet upon the said
land and that they being first sworn before a justice of the peace or
the said Sheriff do diligently view and examine the said land petitioned
for and the lands adjacent thereto on both sides the run of
the said swamp that may be affected or laid under water by
building such mill together with the timber and other conveniences
thereon that they report the same with the true value of the acre
petitioned for & the damages to the party holding the same or to any
other person or persons whatsoever to the next court under their
hands & seals
