Joshua Newcorn having obtained an attachment against the estate of Benjamin Newsum who hath privately stonewalled himself or so removed himself that the ordinary process of the Law cannot be served upon him Benjamin Staffen Gent' Sheriff of this County now made return that he had executed the said attachment in the hands of David Hines Esq; summoning him as garnishee who now appearing & being sworn deposed that he had received a sum from the wife of the said defendant in discharge of a debt of £3. 1. 4 due from the said defendant & the defendant not appearing Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that he recover against the said sum £2. 1. 4 shillings & eight pence to be discharged by One pound four shillings and eleven pence interest from the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July 1775 till paid & costs by him to this behalf expended And it is ordered that the garnishee deliver the aforesum to the Sheriff & that he sell the same at public auction for ready money & therewith pay the Plaintiff's garnishers debt of £3. 1. 4 & apply the residue toward satisfaction of this judgment & costs after satisfaction of Jacob Newsum's judgment & make report thereof to the court.

Cordall & Verfleet having obtained an attachment against the estate of Benjamin Newsum who hath privately stonewalled himself or so removed himself that the ordinary process of the Law cannot be served upon him Benjamin Staffen Gent' Sheriff of this County now made return that he had executed the said attachment in the hands of Henry Turner after satisfaction of Vaughan's attachment & summoned the J<sup>r</sup> Turner as garnishee who appeared & being sworn deposed that he hath a silver watch of the defendant to discharge a debt due him of one pound two shillings due to him from the J<sup>r</sup> defendant & he not appearing on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that he recover against the said defendant the sum of forty pounds ten shillings to be discharged by the payment of twenty pounds five shillings & interest from the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1772 till paid & costs by him to this behalf expended & it is ordered that the garnishee deliver the aforesum watch to the Sheriff & that he sell the same at public auction for ready money and therewith discharge the aforesum judgment & costs & so much thereof as the said wife amount (first paying the garnishee's demand of £2. 2.) after satisfaction of Newcorn's judgment & costs & it is ordered that the Sheriff summon Michael Harris to appear at the next court as a garnishee &c. — Mrs. M'Neil Harris aged 21<sup>st</sup> & dependent she had nothing of her husband & will see her husband in law & will be with him

Ordered that the Churchwardens of the parish of Wallerby bins one John Bennet a poor child according to Law & it is further ordered that the parsonage and inclosure belonging to J<sup>r</sup> Bennet to Benjamin Brown be vacated
