of passing Counterfeit bills of credit of the United Colonies knowing the  
same to be Counterfeit

The court being thus constituted the prisoner was led to the bar by the  
Sheriff to whose custody he was heretofore committed Being charged with  
the offence aforesd, plead not Guilty, Whereupon divers witnesses were  
examined and the prisoner heard in his own defence On consideration  
whereof it is the opinion of the Court that he is not Guilty of the charge  
& that he be forthwith discharged out of Custody R.

this bond for the penalty of Five thousand pounds for the P<sup>t</sup> that Turner do an  
faithful administration on his account etc.
